HEALTH & EMERGENCY INFORMATION

All medical forms for the 2011 – 2012 school year are on the website. Please follow the guidelines below to determine which forms are required for your child(ren).

- ❖ **Physical exams** are required for all new students, students entering preschool and kindergarten and **recommended annually for all students.**
 - **If your child in Pre-K through 8th grade will NOT be participating in any school-sponsored sport during the 2010/11 school year, use the ASSUMPTION SCHOOL STUDENT HEALTH APPRAISAL – Pre-k through 2nd form.**
 - **If your child in Grades 3 – 8 plans on participating in a school-sponsored sports team, use the Physician Form Grades 3-8 - Annual Athletic Pre-Participation Physical Exam Form.**
- ❖ All medication (prescription and over the counter) to be taken during the school day is to be kept in the nurse's office.
 - **Medication Request** form - to be used for prescription and over the counter orders.
 - **Emergency Plan for Allergic Reactions** - If your child requires emergency medication such as an Epi-pen, we should have this medication in the nurse's office at all times with this form completed by the physician.
- ❖ If your child requires an epi-pen or inhaler and will carry it with them during the school day, two (2) forms are required: one that the parent or guardian must complete and sign **Self Administration of Medicine** and one completed by the doctor **Self Administration of Medicine Physician Form**. These forms can be found on the website.
- ❖ If your child is diagnosed with a contagious disease during the school year, such as strep throat, "pink eye", or head lice, please notify the nurse's office. A student diagnosed with "pink eye" requires a physician's note to return to school.
- ❖ If your child suffers an injury or illness which prevents him or her from participating in physical education class, a physician's note is required to excuse your child from class.
