Mission

The mission of Assumption School is to provide students with both the educational and spiritual tools they will need to become productive, morally mature members of society. Our mission includes providing a quality education based on a well-rounded curriculum that is enhanced by spiritual, social and cultural experiences.

History

In September of 1850, Father McQuaid began teaching 25 children in the basement of the Assumption Church. The school remained in the church basement until 1887, when the Bayley School was built and dedicated. The Bayley School prospered as the parish school until other land was donated and the new Assumption School was built and dedicated on Macculloch Avenue. Today, 420 children receive a well-rounded education, developing the mind, body and soul.

Spiritual Development

Instruction includes Catholic doctrine, faith, prayer, liturgy, scripture and sacraments.

Academic Programs

Fundamental elementary studies are offered, as well as enrichment and remedial programs necessary to meet the individual needs of each student.

Beyond the Classroom

Students are involved in various community service projects, as well as a range of extracurricular activities.

Faculty

Our faculty members are fully qualified professionals committed to bringing out the best in our students as they grow in knowledge, skills, and values. Standardized Test Scores

Assumption School students consistently score above the 95th percentile in standardized test scores.
